Loyola Law School Professor Richard L. Hasen's Book Gets Glowing Review in the
Michigan Law Review

Hasen, the William H. Hannon Distinguished Professor of Law, Identified as "One of the Most Accomplished, Respected and Prolific Scholars of Law and Politics"

Los Angeles—Loyola Law School Professor Richard L. Hasen's book, *Judging Equality from Bakker v. Carr to Bush v. Gore*, was recently reviewed by Guy-Uriel Charles, the Russell M. and Elizabeth M. Bennett Professor of Law at the University of Minnesota Law School.

In the review, Charles calls Hasen's work "the first complete account of the purpose and scope of judicial review in democratic politics." He adds that it is a "must-read for anyone interested in the intersection of law and politics." Charles concludes by saying of the book, "(Hasen's) is an important framework against which election law scholars will react and upon which they will build for some time to come."

Loyola Law School Dean David W. Burcham said "We are proud of Professor Hasen's reputation as one of the nation's pre-eminent election law experts."

Professor Hasen is a nationally-recognized expert in election law and campaign finance regulation, is co-author of a leading casebook on election law and co-editor of the quarterly peer-reviewed publication, *Election Law Journal*. He is also a member of the advisory board of the Campaign Legal Center. In 2002, Professor Hasen was named one of the 20 top lawyers in California under age 40 by the Los Angeles (and San Francisco) *Daily Journal*. He also writes the widely read "Election law blog." He joined Loyola's faculty in 1997. Professor Hasen has a BA (with highest departmental honors) from UC Berkeley; a PhD in political science from UCLA; and a JD (order of the coif) from UCLA.
