Loyola Team Are Western Regional Finalists at National Moot Court Competition; Take Best Brief Award

Los Angeles — Loyola Law School Los Angeles' National Moot Court Team were Western Regional Finalists at the National Moot Court Competition, which included 22 law school teams. The team – students Louis Benowitz, Alexander Kargher and Jonathan Starre – also took home the Best Brief Award. The team will represent the Western Region in the national finals to be held in spring 2008 in New York.

Additionally, the team was undefeated after the preliminary rounds, won the octa-final round and the semi-final round.

Rebecca Delfino served as the Scott Moot Court Advisor. Among Delfino's innovations last summer were a two-week writing "boot camp" for all members of the Scott Moot Court Board, including members of the Jessup, ABA and National Moot Court Teams, focusing on appellate brief writing. Delfino was assisted by a team of coaches that included alumni Sayaka Karitani '05, Danielle Colon '05 and Matthew Hall '07.
