Loyola Law School Earns Princeton Review's Top Honors for Classroom Experience, Diversity

Los Angeles – Loyola Law School Los Angeles was ranked first in the newly created “Best Classroom Experience” category in the 2008 edition of the Princeton Review's *Best 170 Law Schools*. Loyola placed in the top 10 in two other rankings: fourth for “Professors Rock (Legally Speaking)” and ninth for “Most Diverse Faculty.”

Loyola Law School scored a 95 in the academic experience rating, a 97 in the professors interesting rating and a 95 in the professors accessible rating. The profile praises Loyola's “brilliant [and] accessible” faculty for being able to “communicate the complex clearly.” As for the academic environment, “Loyola's intimate campus means that you can have lunch with your professors any day you want, get your Con Law taught by the dean who clerked in the Supreme Court, all while being in the heart of one of the biggest legal cities in the world.”

When it comes to producing top-notch attorneys, “the school places a strong emphasis on practical application, skills classes and real-world experience. Loyola is known throughout the LA region for producing top-notch litigators (among them Mark Geragos, Robert Shapiro and Gloria Allred).” As for the class makeup, the review notes that “the students are an incredibly diverse population.”

The rankings are based on institutional data from the schools and on surveys of 17,000 students attending the schools profiled. The survey asked students over 50 questions about themselves, their career plans and their schools' academics, student body and campus life.
