

Loyola Law School Los Angeles Named One of Best Law Schools by *The Princeton Review*; Ranked 3rd in “Best Overall Academic Experience”

October 5, 2005—Los Angeles—Loyola Law School Los Angeles was named one of the nation’s most outstanding law schools by *The Princeton Review*. Out of 159 law schools, Loyola ranked 3rd for “Best Overall Academic Experience,” after the University of Chicago and Stanford, and above Georgetown and the Universities of Michigan, Pennsylvania and Virginia. It ranked 3rd for “Professors Rock,” and 6th for “Best Environment for Minority Students.”

Additionally, Loyola Law School scored a 98 in the academic experience rating; a 98 in the professors interesting rating; and a 96 in the professors accessible rating. Also noted in the profile are Loyola’s “great research resources,” its “abundant externship, internship and clerkship opportunities;” and that “diverse opinions are accepted in classroom.”

The profile also highlights Loyola’s “reputation for producing renowned litigators,” its “emphasis on practical application, skills classes and real-world experience,” that it has a “great reputation among employers in the Southern California area” and “a large alumni network of successful and respected lawyers in California.”

On being recognized as one of the country’s outstanding law schools, Loyola Dean David Burcham said, “We are very pleased to be included in this survey and that our profile recognizes so many of the terrific things happening on our campus.”

Says Robert Franek of the *Princeton Review*, “Every school we profiled offers a terrific law school education, yet each one is distinctive. Our profiles and ranking lists are based on straight-from-the-campus data we collected from school administrators and students at the schools.”

The rankings are based institutional data from the schools and on surveys of 15,000 students attending the schools profiled. The survey asked students over 50 questions about themselves, their career plans and their schools’ academics, student body and campus life.
