Loyola Convenes Tenth Annual Western Conference on Tax Exempt Organizations

Los Angeles, Nov. 14, 2006 —Loyola Law School convenes its tenth annual Western Conference on Tax Exempt Organizations this week with a schedule that features panels led by some of the country's preeminent tax-law authorities. The program, which runs Thursday and Friday at the Marriott Los Angeles Downtown Hotel, will focus on the Pension Protection Act of 2006 and other tax developments of critical importance to charities and other non-profit organizations.

Organized in conjunction with the Internal Revenue Service, the program features an array of prominent tax exemption experts, including Professor Ellen Aprill, a WCTEO founder and John E. Anderson Chair in Tax Law at Loyola Law School Los Angeles. Other panelists include officials from the US Department of the Treasury and the IRS, plus a variety of prominent West Coast tax lawyers.
