## KNOW THE SIGNS

Periods of crisis can make it easier for traffickers to take advantage of those in need. Learn the signs to protect your community.



- Offered help or jobs that seem too good to be true.
- Living in crowded or unsafe conditions with unfamiliar people.
- Threatened, underpaid or unable to leave.

## HOW TO HELP

If something feels wrong, trust your instincts and speak up. Report what you see. It could help someone stay safe.



- Don't confront the trafficker. It could put them at risk.
- Take notes: location, time, people involved, job site info.
- Report it confidentially . Your safety matters too.

## WHO TO CONTACT

Every concern counts. You don't need to have all the facts. Just share what you know. Trained teams can take it from there.
