



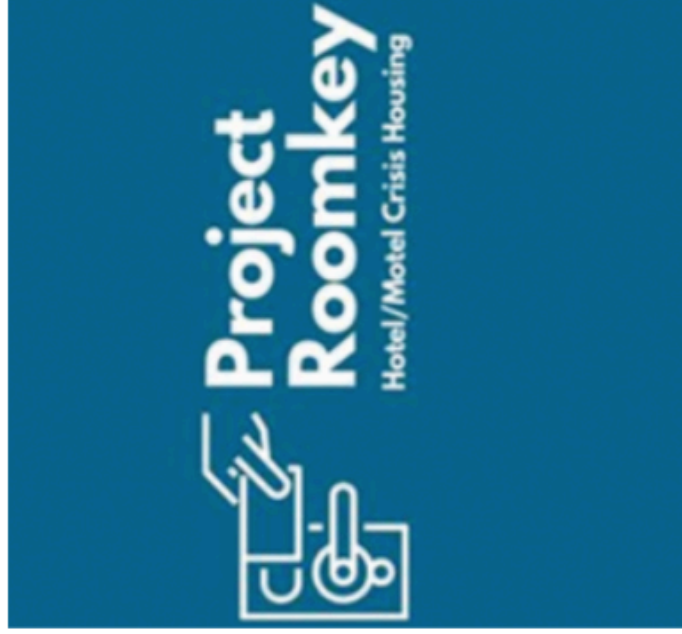
PRESIDENT TRUMP'S PLAN

- The department of housing and urban development is working to break the cycle of poverty by encouraging self-sufficiency among families and administering programs that serve our most vulnerable populations
- Awarded more than \$2.45 billion to communities working to end homelessness
- Awarded \$353.7 million to local governments to provide communities with resource to assist low-income persons living with HIV/AIDS and their families
- Foster Youth to Independence Initiative was launched to provide youth exiting foster programs housing vouchers
- For the first time in nine years, made funding available to support the expansion of affordable rental housing for very low-income persons with disabilities.
- Made up to \$50 million in grant funding available for the development and operation for extremely-low and very-low-income elderly persons.
