TAAP operates similar to an on campus clinic. Under the guidance of a supervising attorney, you will represent clients in a litigation setting. It is a wonderful opportunity to gain real-world experience. And it is a great way to build your professional experience and resume.

You do not need to have an interest in tax. When asked, most former TAAP students say the one skill they improved most in is client interaction skills, how to work effectively with your clients in order to best represent them in their cases.

And although the underlying issue in the cases is tax, these cases touch on many areas of law, contracts, property, community property, residency, etc... And the supervising attorney will teach you about the tax issues, so do not let the tax aspect concern you.

TAAP meets once a week for 2 hours for the classroom component of the program. Other than the scheduled class sessions, you can set your own schedule, approximately 10 hours a week. Also, in some circumstances, you can satisfy the pro bono requirement at Loyola by participating in TAAP.

The TAAP program is available to J.D. students and LLM students. And rising 2L's are encouraged to apply. TAAP is available year round, summer, fall, and spring semesters.
