Please submit the following items to Gary Williams (gary.williams@lls.edu) by Friday, April 17:

1. A current resumé.
2. A completed Civil Rights Litigation Application Questionnaire (four page form).
3. A typewritten statement (3 pages maximum) discussing your interest in public interest litigation, and how you intend to act on that interest after you graduate from law school.

If Interviews are required

If interviews are required, you will be assigned an interview slot by Professor Williams. Interviews will be conducted during the week of April 20 - 25. Assuming the law school campus remains closed, interviews will be conducted via Zoom. If the campus has reopened, you will receive notice of the location for the interviews. Once your interview has been scheduled, please contact Professor Williams if you wish to cancel or re-schedule, or if you have limited availability during the week of April 20.

If interviews are not required and you are admitted to the class, you will receive an email notice by April 23. If interviews are required you will be notified of your status by April 30. If you are on the waiting list, you should not attempt to register for the Civil Rights Litigation Practicum. You can drop four units and add the seminar later.
