

Professor Winograd joins Loyola Law School after having enjoyed a twenty-year tenure in global, national and local law firms in Los Angeles. During the course of her career, Ms. Winograd has had the privilege of representing Fortune 100 and other companies, closely-held corporations and partnerships, and public and not-for-profit entities in virtually every forum—including at the agency level, in arbitration proceedings and in state and federal trial and appellate courts, including the California Court of Appeal and the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit. Professor Winograd's extensive experience in complex litigation spans the commercial, insurance, employment, products liability and securities arenas. The litigation she has handled involves: contract disputes; business torts, including fraud, unfair competition and breaches of fiduciary duty; wrongful termination, discrimination, harassment and wage and hour class actions; insurance coverage and insurer bad faith; smoking and health litigation; stock option backdating and additional securities violations; and a myriad of other disputes. Professor Winograd graduated with Distinction from the University of California, Berkeley, and received her law degree from the University of Michigan Law School. Additionally, she recently obtained a Master's degree from the University of Southern California's Rossier School of Education.
