

SUPPORTED TERMS & CONNECTORS

Grammatical Connectors	Explanation/Examples
/p	The search terms must appear in the same paragraph (hearsay /p utterance)
+p	The first search term must precede the second term in the same paragraph (joinder +p impracticable)
/s	The search terms must appear in the same sentence (personal /s injury)
+s	The first search term must proede the second search term in the same sentence (punitive +s damages)
/n	The search terms must appear within n terms of each other, where n is a number from 1 to 255 (remedies /3 damages)
+n	The first search term must precede the second term by n terms, where n is a number from 1 to 255 (res +2 judicata)
!	Words with multiple endings, such as object! (E.g., object, objects, objected, objection, objecting)
***************************************	Exact phrases. such as "summary judgment" or "bona ide occupational quali ication" . Search terms appear in the same order as they do inside the quotation marks.
AND	Can use AND or & to retrieve documents containing two or more search terms anywhere in the document. For example, the query cash & bail will retrieve documents that contain both terms, no matter where the terms are located in the document.
OR	Use OR, or a space between words, to search for alternative terms. For example, the query attorney lawyer counsel retrieves any document containing at least one of those three terms.
BUT NOT	Use BUT NOT or % to exclude documents that contain certain terms. For example, "good faith" % "fair dealing" will return documents that contain the phrase "good faith" but do NOT contain the phrase "fair dealing".
