# THE COELHO CENTER FOR DISABILITY LAW PARTNERS LEADS DISCUSSION OF REPRESENTATION IN HOLLYWOOD

**LOS ANGELES -** The Coelho Center for Disability Law, Policy and Innovation (TCC) is teaming up with Lights! Camera! Access! 2.0 (LCA 2.0) to host a roundtable discussion on disability representation in media and Hollywood today, Wednesday, Feb. 20, 2019 at the Academy of Television Arts & Sciences, 5220 Lankershim Blvd, Los Angeles, CA 91601.

This roundtable reconvenes the panelists from TCC's inaugural Nov. 5, 2018 symposium session, "Conquering Stigma: Representations of Disability in Media and Entertainment." That panel covered a range of topics including disability stigma in the media, what "diversity" means, the importance of disabled writers writing scripts and disabled actors cast in all types of roles, and pioneers and future programs addressing the lack of training and access into the industry. Returning and other panelists will join a closed-door discussion to craft a white paper that will include calls-to-action and policy proposals.

"This is a critical moment where Hollywood and media are responding to the widespread call to address issues with diversity," said Katherine Perez, TCC director. "This problem includes the lack of disability representation. Previous generations of disabled individuals have not seen themselves reflected in entertainment. It has contributed to the mistreatment of people with disabilities. Today, we have convened disabled thought-leaders across the industry to create an action plan that will include the publication of a white paper."
